We are a domain registry. No. We do not believe that the proposal sufficiently meets the needs and expectations of the global customers and partners of the IANA services. As mentioned in our response to Question 5, there is a lack of attention towards the international community in the proposal. The proposal, in addressing this question, needs to have specific plans for proactively engaging and including global customers into the process that would otherwise, due to cultural and linguistic reasons, might otherwise not be included.

Huyi Global Information Resources (Huyi Global) is the registry operator for two delegated Chinese top-level domains: .商标 translated as .trademark and .餐厅 translated as .restaurant. Our concerns, interests and recommendations towards to ICG about the proposal center around the importance of having a proactive and engaged constituency of global partners and customers involved in the ongoing IANA community both during the transition and post transition. With IANA's continuing oversight and management of critical root zone management functions and responsibilities as well as towards delegation and redelegation of TLD's, we believe that it is imperative that the non-English speaking communities and constituencies be proactively engaged and involved with all functions related to IANA.

As a registry operator of 2 Chinese language IDN gTLDs, Huyi Global stresses the importance of two-way engagement between IANA and Chinese constituencies including businesses and organizations from within the global Chinese speaking community which, in Mainland China alone, has over 600 million internet users, and which also represents the largest IDN applicant and delegated string constituency in the entire new gTLD program.

Failure to actively and effectively engage the Chinese speaking constituency would result in a profoundly negative impact on this immense constituency as well as on the global internet community. Therefore, we recommend that international constituencies and global partners and customers be included as a specific element to any and all proposals going forward, rather than as bullet points or mentions within other elements. More specifically, in the Names Proposal Overview (Slide 12 of IANA STEWARDSHIP TRANSITION PROPOSAL), we recommend that details be included to the CSC (Customer Standing Committee) that show international and global representation and involvement in the post-transition period and going forward to prevent marginalization of not just Chinese speaking market constituencies, but all non-English speaking constituencies.
