## **Comment on IANA Stewardship Transition Proposal**

### **Name: JISA Public Policy Committee**

JISA (Japan Information Technology Service Industry Association) has about 600 member companies from IT Service industry in Japan. JISA is also a member of ASOCIO, WITSA and ICC/BASIS.

We are also working with IGCJ, the Internet Governance Conference Japan who will contribute their comments in an independent submission. JISA also well understands and supports IGCJ, then send complementary views based on IGCJ's comments.

We recognize that "IANA Stewardship Transition Proposal" will well reflect our views from Internet based industry, and will benefit by ensuring trust and whole socio-economic growth in order to utilize the Internet as essential business environment.

JISA supports this proposal because our following concerns are nicely covered.

1. Single, reliable and open Internet is always essential in daily business and economic activities. This is not only for B2B and B2C eCommerce, but also for business use of the Internet in industry sectors like finance, transportation, logistics, manufacturing, energy, medics and education, information systems which supports entire social activities are now based on the healthy Internet usage. in their design, development and operation. Any failure in fluent operation of the Internet, even if it is local or temporal, will be hazardous to our business.

2. Innovations in business based on seamless global data flows on the Internet are essential to inclusive growth in global economy. ICANN's operation has successfully proven its capability and functionality in managing Internet based resources. Unpredictable and significant changes in management organization are not desirable if we consider sustainable growth of market.
